Hi freelancer,

Thanks for considering taking on my Html Clean-up project. You will be asked to tidy up the html in my website [the GarageDoor.com](http://theGarageDoor.com)
You will need to be experienced with Dreamweaver, css styling and website file management.

The reason I need some changes are :

- I hand-coded the site line by line
- I now want to move the whole site over to administer it from Dreamweaver (version 9.0)

The site displays fine on the internet, but I am experiencing some problems:

- File structure is incorrect. Dreamweaver has problems recognizing some files. After "getting" the whole site, at first most html files are present, but Dreamweaver then somehow overwrites some of them and they show 0KB ... Running a *site link check* shows many broken links etc.
- There appear to be several reasons for this:
 - the ../folder/file.html representation may not always be accurate
 - there are white spaces in many of the links, which confuse Dreamweaver: for example `picture.jpg "` instead of `picture.jpg"` and `" ../folder` instead of `"../folder`. It is easy to replace these site-wide with a single *search/replace* command, and I have done that, but this alone does not seem to solve the linking problems.

Plus:

Only the front page and two chapters are written using a css stylesheet. The other pages are full of `` and other tags. Quite messy, as you can see. This all needs to be moved to a stylesheet. I want you to remove most of the unnecessary tags and use a new stylesheet for these pages. I don't mind if you leave the bold and italic tags as they are, whatever is easier. Most of the text is `font size="2" type-face="Arial"` but watch out for different text sizes used, and the different sizes of Header text. You may want to use `<td class="">` styling but be careful because the pages contain nested tables

In short, I want two things:

1. A repaired file and link structure that works well in Dreamweaver.
2. A new stylesheet and removal of most of the unnecessary tags

As I said, the site works well on the web. Apart from some layout consistency (which should come from the use of a stylesheet) I don't need any changes to the structure of the site itself.

I want to leave the site untouched until the replacement works error free. A test

site would be ideal.
